A discussion of the archaeology of Oxford in ten investigations undertaken by Oxford Archaeology between 2010-2022. This includes the excavation of sites like the 'Lady of St Cross College' burial, the Saxon and Jewish occupation of St Aldates, the St John's College library extension and more recent excavations of the Oxford Castle moat ditch and the former Swan's Nest Brewery. This talk offers an exceptional summary of these key Oxford excavations of the last decade and an overview of aspects of the development of the city in the last 1200 years.

Carl is Senior project manager at Oxford Archaeology and has worked in commercial archaeology over the last 20 years. He has been involved in numerous complex excavations in the city centre.
